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

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


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Letters To The Editor.....



This is an article Stacy Ryan received from Duke Power regarding a scam that has been happening around the Duke Power system in recent months. A person posing as a Duke Power employee will come to someone's house, usually an elderly person, and ask if they can come in to check some equipment, a meter, outlets, etc. Of course they are not employed by Duke and are trying to gain entrance so they can rob or steal.

If ever a person comes to your house posing as Duke Power employee asking to come inside to check something, DO NOT let them in. Unless you have called to set up an appointment with a Duke Power employee for a particular reason, Duke Power should never have reason to enter your house. Always ask for identification. Duke employees and contractors carry identification cards and should always be able to present it on request. Most Duke Power field employees will drive a marked vehicle and many wear uniforms that identify them as Duke Power. If you have any questions or concerns about being approached by someone saying they work for Duke, you can call Duke Power at 1-800-777-9898 (Customer Service Center) or your local police department.



Don't Make Me Live in Adams Farm

A new house was recently built on Walker Avenue. It's not hard to pick outit's the only house in Lindley Park with an attached garage. Two more new houses just like it are being built on Walker. How lucky the new owners are, to buy into a beautiful old neighborhood like ours and still have all the conveniences of living in a modern-day subdivision. Wait a minute! Subdivision? If I wanted to live in a subdivision, I would have bought a house in Adams Farm.

Why do I choose to live in Lindley Park instead of Adams Farm? There are the obvious reasons: it's close to where my husband and I work; the trees are amazing; it's safe; and the people are nice... But there are less obvious reasons as well...

I know my neighbors well.

In the morning, they pull out of their drives and wave. In the evening, they pull back in, get out and chat for a minute. They watch our house when we're out of town. They give our cats a pat on the head when they wander by. We all know our neighbors well because we don't have closed in garages; because we walk on our sidewalks and sit on our porches; because our houses are built very close together. It's not for everybody, but it's definitely for me.

My house is different from the one next door.

I live on Scott. You know the big stone house? Nope, not ours, but I live right next door. My house is a Cape Cod cottage with a big high roofline. On the other side of us a single dad and his sons and dogs live in a great Craftsman bungalow from the 20s. Across the street is a tall stately Victorian and kitty-corner is a mail order house from Sears and Roebuck. Let's see Adams Farm beat that for variety!

There's room for everyone.

My street is only three blocks long, yet it has condos, apartments, duplexes and single-family homes with two, three, four, and five bedrooms. There are young families with babies or toddlers or elementary school kids; there are other families with teenagers and grown-up children who only come home on weekends. There are single parents, both moms and dads. Grad students and young professionals live in the condos on one end and the apartments on the other. Some folks are long past retirement; some are headed that way soon. If every house was the same size, the same floor plan, the same number of bedrooms, who would have to move?

The Lindley Park Neighborhood Plan calls this area an established, desirable and durable neighborhood. Those of us who live here know we have a style all our own, built over time and built to last. There aren't many empty lots in Lindley Park, maybe 50 between Lindell and Spring Garden, but each of those lots could become an opportunity for another family, another senior, another college student to experience living in a traditional urban neighborhood. As developers move into our 100-year-old neighborhood, encourage them to help us preserve the character of our neighborhood by building houses and apartments that look like they have been here all along.

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New Housing Construction in Lindley Park

From The Lindley Park Neighborhood Plan

The neighborhood has experienced a substantial increase in rezoning requests for multifamily housing projects. Infill development and home expansion projects have increased and residents would like to ensure that these projects fit with the character of the neighborhood. Plan recommendations include:

- * Identify areas for appropriate single-family infill development in the core area of the neighborhood plan.
- * Actively promote neighborhood development design standards as new developments are proposed to encourage consistency with the neighborhood vision.
- * Utilize the Spring Garden Corridor Plan and the Future Land Use Map to influence the location of mixed-use residential housing along the Spring Garden Corridor and other targeted areas.



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In The Neighborhood....

Have you noticed the changes on the corner of Elam and Walker? There is a lot going on. The Lindley Park Coffee Shop closed its doors and a wine bar, OffShore Lounge, is going to take it's place. I stopped in to speak with Tom, the owner, but unfortunately he wasn't there. I did speak with the construction crew and they indicated that they are working as fast as they can to get it open. The interior looks excellent.

Across the street, Neal Reitzel, the proprieter of Fish Bones, is planning a Pizza and Organic restaurant in the old Wild Magnolia building. Neal, who grew up in Greensboro and who everyone knows said this is going to be a non smoking, healthy, family oriented restaurant. The inside will have tile, stone and hand painted muriel's. There will also be outside dining on the patio. When asked when he plans to open he stated "when it's ready". Sounds reasonable to me.

Neal also said this will be a neighborhood Pizza restaurant and not a standard 'pizza in the box' type of place. This will be a great addition to the *Corner* and to Lindley Park.

The infill houses on Walker are progressing. Both will be two story with attached garages. The house at 2605 Walker is approximately 1330 SF and is listed at \$185,000. The one next door at 2607 Walker Ave. is listed at \$194,000 and is approximately 1425 SF. WOW! Due to the low laying lots, it remains to be seen how these properties and the surrounding houses will drain after a heavy rain.

There is discussion regarding the white apartments that now exist on Spring Garden St. (corner of Elam and Spring Garden. A developer is considering a Student Housing project on this property. Is this what we want and does it fit the neighborhood plan?

Fentress has broken ground on his proposed project. He is building a small shopping area on Spring Garden.
