

Minutes - May 28, 2013 Lindley Park Neighborhood Association General Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:06pm by Larry Barnes Larry welcomed everyone for the May General Meeting - and let the group know the minutes from the January General Meeting ing were approved by executive committee and posted in the February edition of columns.

April executive committee minutes - motion by Virginia to accept and seconded by Frank.

Treasurer's Report - Blake Sagar - we spent \$530 for the Spring Fling (band, grill rental, meat) and have \$3,900 in our account. Larry is working on a budget so we can better plan for recurring items and events.

We welcomed Officer Jim Clayton (our community resource officer) and Captain Joel Cranford (the Central Division Commander) who discussed how the police department functions as a resource for us. Officer Clayton may be reached at 336 412-3919 if anyone has questions or need follow up. He let us know of recent car break-ins and reminded us to keep car locked and valuables out of sight.

Captain Cranford said one of his and his team's goal is to engage at the neighborhood level, drive crimes stats down and head off problems. He agreed there are no noticeable crime trends in our area other than car larceny - especially around the UNCG area. He let us know that if we have an issue and aren't sure who in the city to contact - we can start with the p lice and they will help reach out to the correct city department

Please keep passing on information - it is helpful to the police in identifying trends before they become bigger problems. When in doubt - call - and if you're not sure if you have an emgency or not - call 911.

We appreciate their answering specific questions and look forward to working with them to keep Lindley Park safe!

FIRST MORAVIAN CHURCH OFFERS A NEIGHBORLY WELCOME


No doubt you've seen the traffic jams on South Elam during the first weekend in December, and noticed folks in 18th century costume scurrying around the campus of First Moravian Church. Chances are good that you have attended their Candle Tea, held that weekend for the last 50 years to demonstrate long-standing Moravian Christmas customs and preparations. (Surely you've bought a chicken pie or some apple dumplings!?) Maybe you are among the many neighbors who attend one of three candlelight Lovefeast services each Christmas Eve. Or perhaps you've been awakened by the church's brass band greeting the sunrise on Easter morning.

What you may not know about First Moravian Church, which straddles the Lindley Park and Sunset Hills neighborhood, is that it is part of a worldwide Protestant denomination that traces its roots back before Luther's reformation to the followers of a Czech priest, John Hus, who was martyred in 1415.

The Moravian Church is a mainline Protestant denomination that encompasses a wide range of viewpoints – as reflected in its motto: "In essentials unity; in non-essentials liberty; in all things love."

While there are many Moravian churches in Winston-Salem, First Moravian, which celebrates its 105th anniversary on October 6, 2013, is the first and only one in Greensboro. The congregation moved from its original location on Lee Street to its present spot at 304 South Elam in 1937.

Since that time it has maintained and increased an active presence that includes classes for all ages at 10:00 a.m., followed by an 11:00 a.m. worship service every



Sunday. Fellowship and service opportunities abound during the week, including regular Wednesday night suppers, elementary, middle and senior high youth programs, monthly men's and women's fellowship meetings, monthly "Prime Timers" outings for those fortunate enough to be in AARP age range, choir and handbell rehearsals, and more. Members collect food for the Servant Center, cook and serve dinner at the Greensboro Urban Ministry night shelter, deliver Mobile Meals, and support a slew of other local and foreign outreach programs such as Pathways, Stop Hunger Now, the Heifer project and many others. (The current goal is to buy a motor scooter for a pastor who has to cover a lot of ground in Tanzania!)

Two items recently added to the church calendar offer a special welcome to neighborhood friends and families:

On the last Saturday of most months, children ages 3 – 12 are welcome to attend an evening of fun programs at the church from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.- while their parents enjoy a FREE Parents' Night Out. Call text, or email Julie at 336-932-0576 / jules27320@yahoo. com for details and reservations.

And on the third Sunday of each month, anyone interested in an informal, participatory worship experience is invited to the church's fellowship hall at 9:00 a.m. for coffee and a breakfast snack, some lively, casual music, and a discussion (rather than a sermon) based on the day's Scripture readings. This new service, which is called Worship As You Are, welcomes all ages and extends the church's vision statement: United in Christ, Reaching out in love, Changing lives.


