FROM THE CHAIR

So I have written numerous times before about our neighborhood and strong community. I also have talked before about how important the "Columns" and List serve is in maintaining the flow of information from neighbor to neighbor. There have been a couple of instances over the past few months that have illustrated our strength in staying in touch with one another when dealing with situations close to each of us.

One of the more important was on February 5th when one of our residents wrote in to report a suspect fleeing a routine traffic stop and hiding within Lindley Park. This information was immediately passed on to everyone on List serve and our Facebook page was updated. Within three hours, the police had the suspect in custody. Many people took the time to write in expressing their appreciation for this form of communication and our ability to reach so many people quickly. This included a note from our Community Resource Officer from GPD.

The other instance that comes to mind (and ultimately the reason I am writing this) is when the City announced the delay in trash pick-up after the large snowfall in January. We passed along the City's decision to make Friday of that week "trash" day instead of Tuesday. What struck me was driving around Tuesday and seeing the number of trash cans at the street and knowing those were the households that were not being reached by List serve. Those were the households that were not aware of an individual creeping through the neighborhood trying to evade police on February 5th.

I continue to encourage residents to provide us with your contact info. It is used for no other reason than to pass information like these two

events onto you in a timely manner. With my informal "trashcan" poll I estimated we are reaching about half of our households. Let's raise our percentage in 2014 – write us a note at lpnagso@gmail.com and let us know to add your name, address and email to the LPNA List serve. You too then will be able to benefit for information about zoning, crime, social events, City services, etc.

This is a great neighborhood – be a part of it!

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Minutes - February 25, 2014 Lindley Park Neighborhood Association General Meeting (rescheduled from January due to inclement weather)

The meeting was called to order at 7:02pm. We welcomed Judson Clinton (city forester) and Steven Phipps (field ops for the city) to talk about the lack of notification when trees were taken down in the park. Where can we go from here?

When the City Forester is called out, his first thought is saving the tree public safety is another factor. As trees get old and decline, we look for areas to plant new trees.

In cases where we have monoculture trees (all of the same kind) this can create similar problems all at the same time.

When park trees don't necessarily abut someone's property what is the communication path?

Depending on the area depends on what kind of trees will thrive in general we have success with beeches and oaks in the park. Sugar maples are not considered native to our area. A resident asked if the city could look at the long range original plan for the park from J Van Lindley. Yes, the purpose is to look at the long range plan. Replanting is normally the 23" diameter size, relatively good sized. We had a brief conversation about going through the Neighborwoods program in 2014 and asking residents to participate at the Spring Fling, apply for the grant and then have a "planting day".

Follow up from the city:

- find the plan
- keep community involvement in the forefront
- make a new— plan we want to work together!

Treasurer's Report - Blake Sagar

\$4200 - our contributions are off slightly, advertising revenue is up slightly

New Business

Open Positions: Patti nominated Stephen Johnson as First Vice Chair; Patti nominated Bill Eckard for Public Safety. There were no nominations for Ways & Means. Patti offered to be our District 3 rep as Stephen moves to First Vice. We reviewed all current open positions and then Larry moved to accept by acclimation all were approved.

Friendly Coalition requested LPNA to send a letter in support of their efforts to stop the commercial zoning of the area on the corner of Hobbs and Friendly. We discussed the pros and cons and ended with the idea that we would send a letter in support of "neighborhood preservation and selfdetermination". Larry will draft the letter and send for approval.

Patti gave an update on the LPNA anniversary party we had in January thanks to all who turned out and who helped to make the day special for our former chairs!

Tree trimming complete up to Merritt Drive, Sunset Hills is next

ByLaws- Anne still needs to send out; was decided that Stephen, Jeri and Anne will work on these as a small group and then report back to the board.

Old Business - Column repair just waiting on good weather. We will close the street while the columns come down. We'll work on the wrought iron once the work begins.

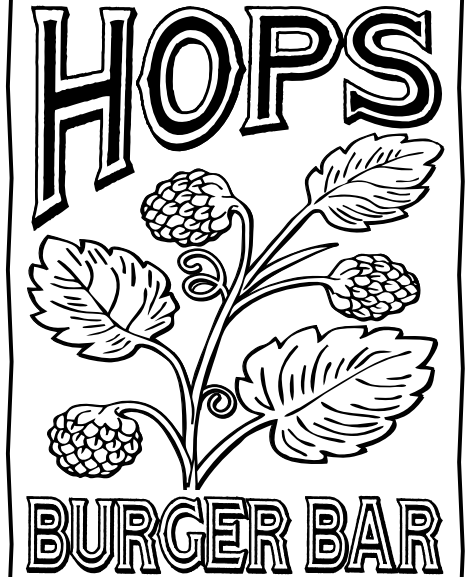

Long Walk to Water Service Learning Project

Lindley students have learned the story of the Lost Boys of Sudan and about the challenges of clean water in many African countries. With leadership from 5th grade UNCG interns, the whole school has been engaged in raising \$5,000 to sponsor a well through Water for South Sudan to bring clean water to people in need. Lindley students participated in ACC Penny Wars during the ACC tournaments, spirit days and more to help raise funds. This month, students are "Walking the Journey" with a goal of collectively walking/running 1,000 miles, like the Lost Boys did in Africa. Lindley held a special "Water Day" on April 3rd with water-related activities and programs to build on what they have learned. Two local Lost Boys, Anthony Majok and Peter Akot, have helped share their personal stories with our students and families through school visits and the Long Walk to Water Book Club. This has been a wonderful service learning project for our school! 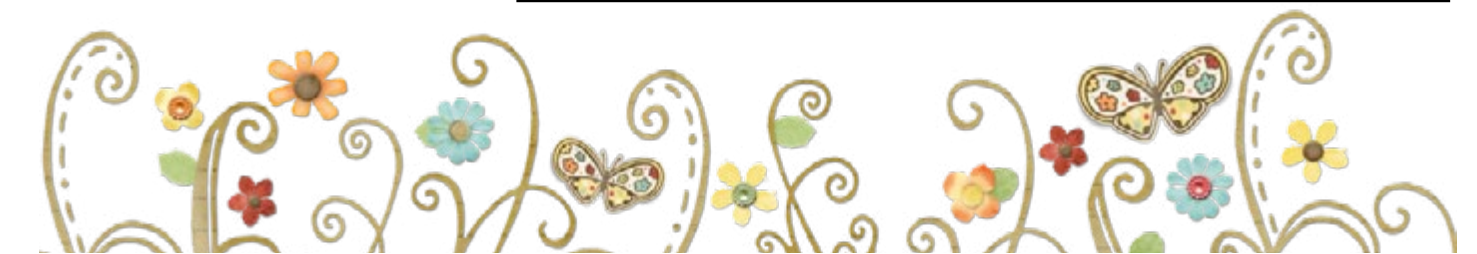
