Every Home Needs An Address

Why is it important to post your address? It helps emergency responders protect you in case of an emergency. By making sure you address in visible, you can be located faster. Also by posting your address in the correct place, you allow delivery services, postal services, and utility service providers to find you faster. Lastly, IT IS THE LAW!



Placement

Address numbers must be placed within three feet of the front entrance to the house or in a location that can be seen from the street in both directions.

Use Large Numbers

Every single family house should use numbers that are at least three inches high. The numbers should face the correct street.

Color

The color of you address numbers must contrast with the background.

Locate Near the Road

If you house is not visible from the street, post numbers so they are clearly visible from the road.

Maintenance

Several times per year, trim the bushes, vines, flowers, and weeds so that all numbers are visible.

Meet Pip, a young indoor cat who has a single heartworm living in his heart. He contracted heartworms from an infected mosquito.

After multiple negative heartworm tests, normal chest x-rays and blood work, Pip was diagnosed with feline heartworm disease during a cardiac ultrasound.

Like dogs, cats should also be on a monthly heartworm prevention, either orally or topically, to protect them from heartworm disease.

Discussions

Currently seem to be two Facebook pages - need to resolve issue.

1. Listserv - Chair is in charge of sending out emails

- Designated for quick, timely community notices such as lost animals, lost children, suspicious activities
- Also send out newsletter through email blast
- Don't resend other material such as GNC - direct folks to appropriate sites for signing up. If listserv notice goes out, post on Facebook page as 'official' LPNA notice

2. Website - Michael as lead. Website to include official neighborhood content

- a. newsletter - current and archive
- b. minutes of meetings - current and archive
- c. neighborhood history

d. event notices

e. business listings

f. newsletter submission deadlines and publications dates

g. Neighborhood overlay

h. Links to other local sites such as City, GNC - direct folks to other sites for signing up for other emails

Possibly add blog, highlight newsletter article, rotate images as header, more images with people. Highlight advertisers in the business listing

3. Facebook page

- Designed for open forum for neighborhood discussions (and gripes) - more casual relationship
- Not resolved whether there should be a clear note that not all comments etc. represent LPNA stance
- Not heavily moderated
- Ask Jessica if she would like to lead management of the site
- Only Chair can indicate if a notice is posted as from LPNA, all other posts must be as individual
- Local business persons can post to site, but encourage them to post on their FB site and make links, or notify users about their site
- Encourage local businesses who post to LPNA site to participate in advertising through newsletter

The Committee will meet prior to monthly executive meetings.

Good, Cheap And Fast

This new Columns section will include recipes that are as the title indicates (good, cheap and fast) and are favorites at our house. Hope you try them and enjoy as much as we do!

Panzanella Salad

This is such a great summer salad! The recipe is really flexible and can be expanded to include other ingredients like cucumber, parsley, green onions, arugula, olives or feta cheese.

1 state baguette (18 inches cut into bite-sized cubes)

1/3 cup plus 2 tbsp olive oil

3/4 tsp salt

1/4 tsp black pepper

1 garlic clove

3 tbsp balsamic vinegar

3 tbsp drained capers, chopped

1 1/2 lbs tomatoes cut into 1 inch pieces

1 small red onion thinly sliced

1 lb. fresh mozzarella, cut into 1 inch chunks

1/2 cup chopped basil



Preheat oven to 375.

Toss bread cubes with 2 T oil, 1/4 tsp salt, and pepper on a large sheet pan. Spread into one layer. Bake, stirring once, for 12 to 15 minutes or until golden.

Mince garlic and 1/2 tsp salt into a paste. Transfer to a large bowl and whisk in vinegar, capers, and 1/3 oil.

Add croutons, tomatoes, onion, mozzarella, and basil; toss. Let sit 30 minutes before serving.

Note: This salad can be made 3 hours ahead and chilled.

Tree Trimming Update

Passionate debate about tree trimming rules continued on May 9th at Lindley Park Recreation Center.

The meeting agenda focused on the proposed law created in response to public objection over Duke's tree trimming practices. It also gave residents the opportunity to ask questions and provide input to the tree committee in advance of the public hearing on the new law.

Local residents met with Council members Nancy Vaughan and Marikay Abuzuaiter and several expressed their frustrations over Duke Energy's role in the current version of the ordinance. Many pleaded with the council to enact specifics into law and not to rely on guidelines that Duke Energy developed. Vaughan said city's power to regulate Duke is limited, given the N.C. Utility Commission could upend any law it sees as a threat to the safe delivery of power.

The public hearing on the city's tree ordinance was initially scheduled for May 21 but was delayed until June 18. City Council Tree Committee Chairwoman Nancy Vaughan asked for more time to see if the city can accommodate changes requested by residents.
