Old Business:

New Business:

Vice Chair Position: Dan resigned his position, and the Vice Chair position is open

Environmental (Elizabeth Link):

Stairs that go from Willowbrook up to walker- parks and rec is getting involved and recommends the stairs be taken out, sidewalk repair to be done, and put a paved concrete access at the bottom of the hill before the creek, they want our feedback-they want to extend the fence on the bridge from the bridge to the first holly tree, we agree the stairs should be removed and we would like for it to be a bush/shrub barrier instead of a fence

Communications (Steve Eury):

Social Committee (Stephen Johnson):
