Kellin Foundation (in the Lindley Park Baptist Church Property):

- -Mental health facility-for people who don't have resources to access care across the lifespan (infants to geriatrics), integrated approach (housing groups, food partners, other mental health practitioners)
- -Free services-access to mental health and substance use disorders
- -2013 became a non-profit, 2016 opened its doors.
- -nationally recognized center of excellence

- -Hope Hub: here at the church property, prevent mental health crisis (on-site full time), Beyond Sports, food pantry, Backpack Beginnings
- -building a hub of non-profit partners where services can be offered in one building.
- -historical connections between Lindley Park Baptist Church and Mental Health Greensboro which merged with the Kellin Foundation in the 2020s.
